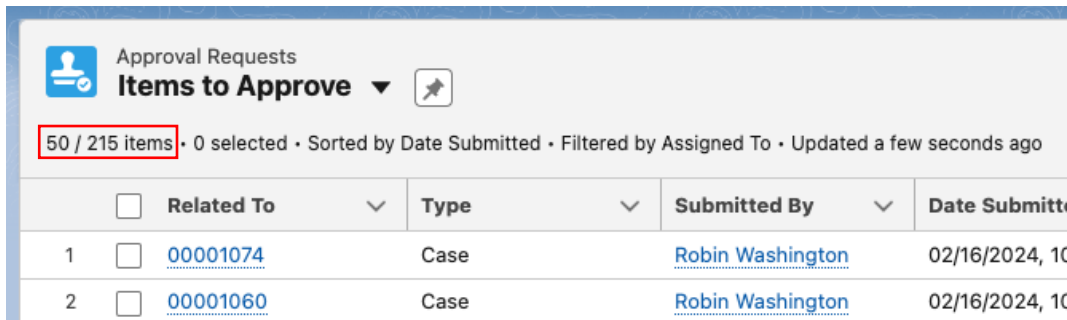
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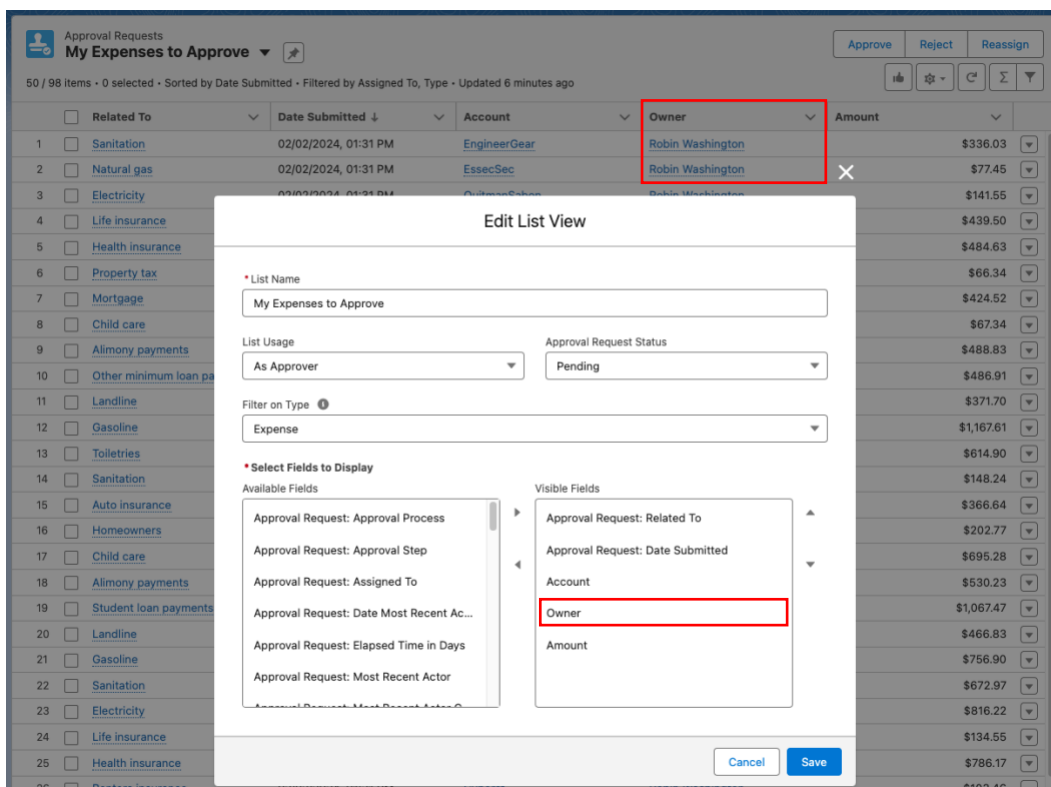
1 View Total Number of Approval Requests

When users view a list of approval requests, they will initially see a default batch of 50 approval request items. As you scroll, subsequent batches load dynamically. Previously, the informational text below the list view title would show only the number of loaded items and a plus (+) sign if there are more items still to be loaded. As of now, the total number of approval requests is displayed. This figure represents the complete set of requests that fit the selected list view and any applied quick filters.



2 Include Record Owner as Column

One of the core features of Enhanced Approval Requests Pro is the ability to create approval list views with fields of the related object. The app already supported most type of standard and custom fields, but in some situations the record owner was missing. This was the case when the owner can be a user or a queue. As of now, you can always select the record owner as a field column, whether it's a user or a queue. To include the record owner in a public list view (one that is available for all users or a group of users), the Owner ID as a Type Field needs to be selected. See section 5.2 of the [configuration guide](#) for instructions. To include the record owner in a private list view, simply select Owner as a visible field.



3 Reassign Approval Requests to Queues

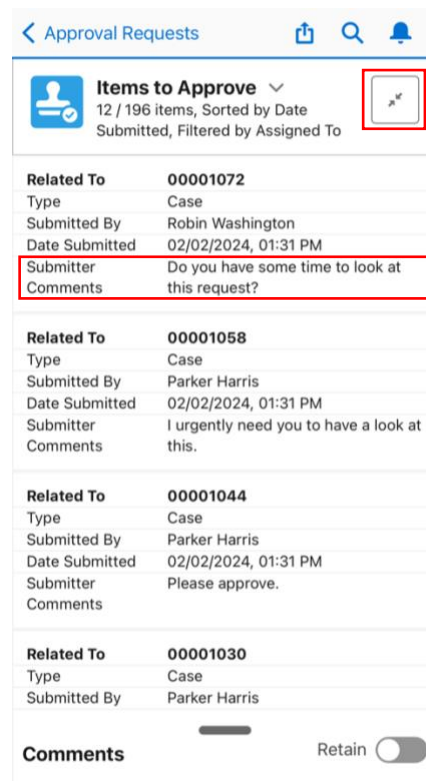
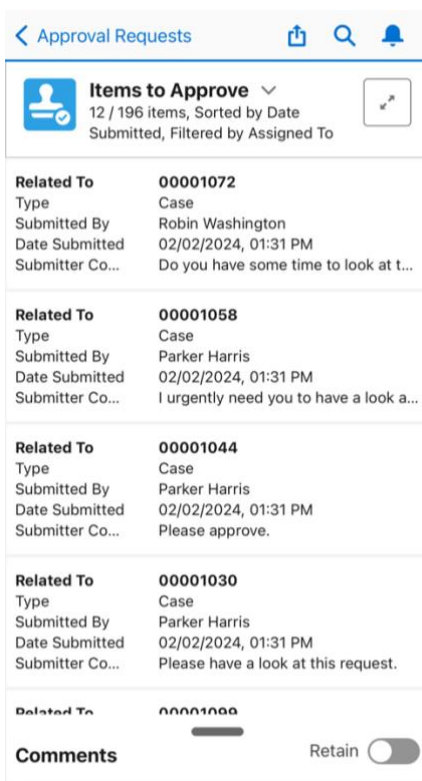
Previously, approval requests could only be mass reassigned to a user. As of now, you can also choose to reassign multiple requests in one go to a queue.



4 Manage Approval Requests on Mobile with Improved Experience

We have made several improvements to the Approval Requests page on mobile.

- Next to the list view title, there is now a button to wrap/unwrap the text of field names and field values. Especially in case of long field names or values, such as submitter comments, it could be handy to click the wrap button, so that you can read the full text. In the screenshots below, the left image shows approval requests in unwrapped view and the right image in wrapped view.
- The name and value of the first field on an approval request card are now shown in bold text, with the purpose to make it visually easier to distinct the cards.
- The informational text below the list view title, now also shows to the total number of approval requests, for example 12 / 196 instead of 12+.
- We have made it easier to switch from list view. Previously you needed to click exactly on the list view title to open the list of available list views. Now you also click on the informational text, so just anywhere next to the approval requests icon.





5 Bug Fixes and User Experience Enhancements

- Previously, when an approval request was assigned to multiple individual approvers, an approval user could experience an error when approving or rejecting the request. This is now resolved.
- It was already possible to view approval requests assigned to a queue. Now you can also view approval requests assigned to any type of user group. (See section 8 of the [configuration guide](#) for more details.)
- We have upgraded the API version of all code and Lightning components in the package to the latest Salesforce API version. This makes sure Enhanced Approval Requests Pro is up to date with the latest security measures.
- We've introduced several UI enhancements to provide a more polished and user-friendly interface.
